Changes Applicable Only to Applications Filed on or After November 5, 2018



New Changes Applicable to All Pending and Future Applications



Electronic submissions will now receive actual date of submission.

• New applications: Can file electronically on a date when the Office is closed for business to beat a disclosure-related deadline.



Only one extension of time for a maximum 6 months is available.



Deadlines falling on holiday or weekend are automatically extended to following business day when CIPO is open.

Colour can form part of the design



Animated designs (frames in a sequence) are protectable



Expedited search (no additional fee) available upon submission of priority document
