

Bill C-86: Maintaining a Register of Individuals

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BLG's client toolkit provides guidance for federal corporations governed by the *Canada Business Corporations Act* that will be impacted by this new legislation.

Canadian private federal corporations will be required — as of June 13, 2019 — to maintain a register of individuals considered to have significant control of a business in accordance with Bill C-86, the *Budget Implementation Act, 2018, No. 2*.
